
Welcome to the Inspiring Learning for All website!

The homepage




- This page presents the five main sections of Inspiring Learning for All the sections are colour-coded.
- Look out for the **New user guide** a button towards the top right of the page, or a hyperlink at the bottom) this provides a very useful overview when looking at the site for the first time:
- Hyperlinks at the bottom of each page provide a permanent link to useful information, including the

following: o the Site map lists the site's content fully, providing a more linear approach to the structure of the site, o pages in each of the 5 sections include links to useful documents, which expand on and illuminate what is being presented on that page; the Download library provides all the Inspiring Learning for All documents, o the FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) are worth a look, to see what others want to know

1 Introduction






- A section on learning includes quotes from learners themselves.
- 'How have we got here?' provides a useful background to the pilot sites for Inspiring Learning for All, and lists everyone who participated.


2 Use the framework




- 'Prepare the ground' has lots of useful practical advice from setting up an Inspiring Learning for All team, to workshop activities and presentations.

- The 'Generic Learning Outcomes (GLOs)' show what kinds of learning take place in museums, libraries and archives:




• Seven Steps in the process take Inspiring Learning for All users through the actions and the research process needed to assess learning in their service, including checklists and questionnaires.

3 Win support




- This section looks at advocacy, gaining support, partners and funding.
