- The Olympic Games is the world's biggest peacetime project and a huge logistical operation which will create many business opportunities. There will be 10,500 athletes competing at 31 venues across the UK in 26 different sports, 20,000 media attending, 500,000 visitors a day to Olympic venues, and nine million tickets sold. The Paralympic Games will have 20 sports, 21 competition venues, 4,000 athletes, and 2,300 officials.
- The Olympic Delivery Authority recently announced the Delivery Programme for the Olympic Park, and will be letting contracts for the delivery of the venues, transport and other infrastructure between now and 2008, with many more subcontracting opportunities also becoming available. The London Organising Committee will procure the enormous

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range of goods and services required for the Games, including sports equipment, uniforms, food and drink, furnishings for venues, cars and hotel accommodation. Most of these contracts will begin in 2009 and go through to 2012 itself.
